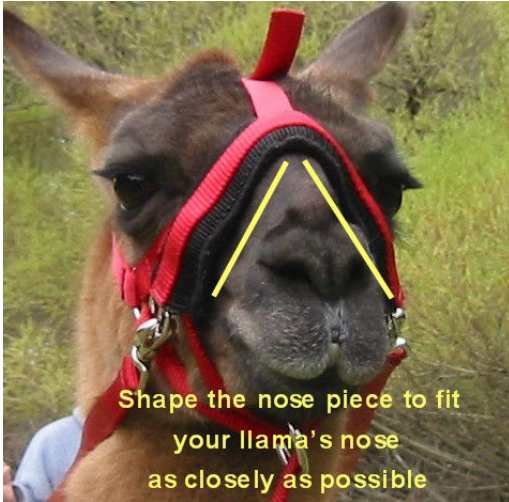


FITTING THE LOGAN DRIVING HALTER



Place the halter on your llama and snug up all the straps so that nose band is close to the eyes.

Take note of where the nose piece needs to be bent in order to match the contours of your llama as closely as possible. (The halter in the photo has not yet been adjusted.)

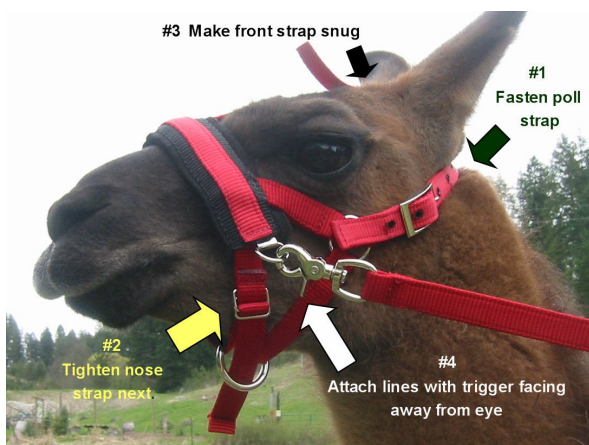
There should NOT be room enough to chew, as the llama should only wear a driving halter when he's working. Do not leave the driving halter on when llama is resting.

Please take your time in getting the fit just right.

The better the fit, the more responsive your llama will be to your commands, and the more pleasurable it will be to drive her.



The "V" of the metal nose piece can be made more rounded by placing the halter over the edge of a 2x4 and striking with a hammer. The ends can be bent inward by placing each edge of the nosepiece in a vise or over the end of a work bench or table and applying pressure downward. A pair of large channel lock pliers works well to give added leverage, if necessary. Overall width can be adjusted by using both hands to pull the ends of the nose piece apart, or push them together.



After the nose piece has been adjusted, place on llama using the photo as a guide on the sequence of tightening the straps. Excess strap ends can be cut with a pair of scissors and burned with a match to prevent unraveling.

Once adjusted for a particular llama, the halter can be removed and put back on by unbuckling the poll strap only. The forehead strap can be unbuckled when haltering if your llama shies away from this

new strap. Most llamas quickly get used to the forehead strap, and will permit you to push their right ear forward while putting on the halter so that the forehead strap can remain buckled. Please do not remove this strap as it plays an important role of holding up the nose band.
